#### The School Day

School times are:

Any children at school before 8.30am are to go to Skids or sit under the rotunda until the first

bell.

Please note for student safety, if your child is sick, late or absent for the day it is important you phone the school office on 534-6543 or go onto the school website and click on 'Report an Absence' to send an email to the office, by 8.50 am. Our office staff follow up students who are unaccounted for.

#### Stationery

Your child's stationery list is on the website under parents, and is also held at Paper Plus, 71 Picton St, Howick. We ask that all books are named and brought into school ready for the first day, including a pencil case with named pens and pencils. Books will be labelled with subjects at school.

# Library Bags

Students need their named school library bag at school on the first day. If you need to purchase a new library bag these are available from the school library for \$5.00.

# Uniform

All children need to start the year in our summer school uniform. Please name all items with a permanent marker, especially your child's sandals, sweater and hat so we can get them back to their owners easily.

#### **GIRLS Summer:**

- Red polo shirt with striped collar in regulation material and style.
- · Black 'school' sandals.

- Plain stud earrings and no jewellery or nail polish please

#### **BOYS Summer:**

- Navy shorts in regulation material and style.
- Red polo shirt with striped collar in regulation material and style.
- Black 'school' sandals.
- Regulation style navy sun hat or cap

For PE activities students wear navy shorts and a BBPS sports top. Girls are allowed to wear navy bike pants under their uniform or for sport. As it is so hot, it is important to ensure your child has their named hat on the first day of school.

#### **Swimming**

The school pool may be operating from the first day, so please send in your child's named togs and towel.

Senior School Swimming Sports will be held at Howick Intermediate on Friday the 28th of February (with a saving day on the 4th of March). There are competitive and noncompetitive races for students to opt into. There will be a small charge for the buses of \$5.00 per child if you would like your child to participate in the day. We would appreciate parent help on this day - please indicate on the permission form below if you are able to support, or talk to Mr Chamberlain.

#### **Bring Your Own Devices (BYOD)**

The Senior School has been using Apple iPad and Apple Minis. This year Chromebooks have also been introduced. If your child has an Apple Mini we also suggest they have a keyboard. We ask all children with devices to bring them on the first day so the teachers can set up routines. (Note: devices are not compulsory, just encouraged.) There are some school devices available in classrooms for students to use. All devices will be locked in a cabinet when they are not in use. It is important that devices are named and charged before they are brought to school each day. All students will be given passwords to allow them access the school internet and their class dashboard. Please note that internet access is turned off at 3 pm each day. New students will need to also have their signed BYOD agreement with them on the first day. # **Maths Homework**

The Senior School will continue to use Maths Buddy online. We believe that this is one of the best online New Zealand programmes available for teaching maths strategies. Maths Buddy also gives more flexibility for the children to work on their own individual needs and at their own pace. We have had very positive parent feedback, as the videos are helpful to learn how strategies are now taught. If you would like your child to access Maths Buddy, the cost is \$30 for the year. If you choose for your child to access Maths Buddy, we ask you to factor this into homework time.

# **Puberty Talk for Girls**

There will be a parent evening to discuss the upcoming puberty talk on the 28th of February at 7pm. The girls will have their puberty talk at school on the 1st March.

#### **Lunch boxes/Drink Bottles**

School lunches can be ordered on the school website from the second week, on Thursdays and Fridays. As the first term is always very hot we encourage all children to have a named water bottle in class. It is also helpful if all lunch boxes are named as these sometimes get left on the seats outside the classroom. As part of our enviro ethos, we encourage wrapper free (nude) food in lunch boxes.

#### Year 6 Camp

Year 6 camp will be heading off to camp in Ngaruawahia on the 11th of February, returning to school on Thursday the 14th (at approximately 4.00 pm). Updates of the bus trip back will be placed on the school website, so parents know the exact time of arrival. This saves phoning the office. Please note, most Year 6 children (and teachers) will be exhausted after four physically challenging days at camp. We encourage you to keep your child at home on the Friday 15 February if you are able. Normal class programmes will resume on the following Monday.

#### Beach Education/ Year 5 EOTC Day at Mairangi Bay

There will be a Year 5 Surf Education day at Mairangi Beach on Tuesday 19 February for Room 4 and half of Room 3, and on February the 20th for Room 2 and the other half of Room 3. We have had to divide Room 3 to accommodate numbers. We would love as many parents as possible to come and get in the water with the students. Traditionally this has been a great day for our "Dads" to join in. This will be a long day, leaving school by bus just after 7.30am and returning by 4.00pm. The cost for the day \$25 per child. The day goes ahead even if the day is wet. The school website will be updated each day to confirm bus return time as traffic can alter this.

#### **Have a Go Sailing**

The Year 6 students will be taking part in the "Have a Go" sailing programme on the 25th or 26th of February. Room 18 will attend from 9.00am - 12:00 pm and Room 1 from 11.30 am- 3.00pm on the 25th of February. Room 19 will attend from 11.30 am- 2.45 pm on the 26th of February. There is no charge for the programme, and is within walking distance of school. We will require parent helpers to walk the students to and from the venue, and to help on the water. If you are able to assist, please fill in the permission form at the end of this newsletter.

#### **Student Council**

Last year our Student Council was instrumental in creating a student voice in our school. The students had many great ideas and took part in supporting change. This year we will continue to have a nominated representative from each class, to share ideas about school issues. Those students who are Whānau leaders and Enviro leaders will also take an active part in Student Council meetings.

#### Whānau Leadership Day

We congratulate our Year 6 students who have been named as Whānau leaders. They have a Leadership training session on the 22nd February, learning about the habits of highly effective leaders.

#### Life Education

The Life Education bus will be visiting the school week 6 and week 7. There will be a \$5 charge per pupil if you would like them to attend. More information will follow.

# Official Permission Form

# February 2019

Dear Year 5 Parents,

As part of our education outside the classroom programme, Year 5 have a trip booked to go to Mairangi Bay to learn about beach and surf safety on the 19th and 20th of February.

Beach Ed is a full day curriculum-based beach and surf safety course delivered by trained surf lifeguards. It is different from all other water safety programmes as it provides students with a real experience of Surf Lifesaving. Students are immersed in a Surf Life Saving environment with hands on experience of beach and surf conditions. The programme begins by covering basic principles of staying safe while having fun at the beach, then leads to more in-depth surf knowledge. This culminates in students learning how to identify hazards such as rip currents, ways to keep themselves and others safe, and what action to take if they get into trouble. Activities are set in the clubhouse, on the shore and in the water.

Due to number restrictions, Room 4 and half of Room 3 will go on the 19th February, and Room 2 and the other half of Room 3 will go on the 20th February. Room 3 parents will be advised separately as to which day their child will attend. Mrs Chilvers will attend both days, and her half class that remains at school will join Room 1. The cost of the trip is \$25, (\$10.00 for cost of bus, and \$15:00 for the Beach Education programme). On the day of the trip, students are required to be at school at 7.30 am, ready for an 8am departure. They will finish the day at Mairangi Bay at around 2.30 pm, and will return to school around 4.00 pm.

The programme requires a minimum of 1 adult to every 4 students in the water. We would very much like to reduce this ratio by having extra parent support to supervise. Supervising parents and teachers will participate in all water and beach activities, and need to be prepared to get wet (please bring togs and a wetsuit if you have one). If you are unable to enter the water you are more than welcome to attend as a spectator, however you will not be assigned a group of children to supervise. It is essential all supervisors can enter the water.

# Requirements for this day

# **Clothing**

Students need to come to school in a pair of shorts, T-shirt and a hat. For the day they need their swimsuit, towel, sunblock, and a plastic shopping bag for wet togs, packed in their school bag. They may also like a sweater, should the day turn cold and long trousers for the end of the day.

#### **Food and Drink**

All children need to eat a good breakfast <u>before</u> they leave home to prepare them for the day. The children will be doing a lot of physical activity over the day and will be hungry. Please pack a substantial lunch, morning tea, and some small snacks (e.g. muesli bars to eat on arrival and before leaving Mairangi Beach). We recommend packing **two** bottles of water for the day.

#### **Medical Needs**

Please ensure all medical equipment not kept at the school office is with your child, and your child's teacher has been notified.
